
WE ARE ALSO ANIMALS V YOU DON'T BELIEVE US?

This cute little Skye Terrier was brought into the family of John Gray, who had moved to Edinburgh in 1850 and started earning his daily bread as a city police night watchman. The master and his dog would walk together through murky alleys and keep a close eye on their safety. They didn't care whether winters were brisk or biting and didn't mind the summer heat or the fall rain because they were having a good time together and that was what mattered.

In February 1858, however, John Gray died of tuberculosis. He was buried in the Greyfriars cemetery and everyone was supposed to move on. But his loyal dog, Bobby, sat at his master's grave and waited. The grave-keeper's efforts to chase him away were fruitless: Bobby would always come back, whether the sun was glaring down or it was raining cats and dogs or whether it was freezing or snowing, Bobby wouldn't leave his spot for an incredible 14 years.

Good people would bring him food and take care of him. After he passed away, they made him a statue so Bobby and his unconditional dog love and loyalty would never be forgotten.

HOW TO TAKE CARE OF DOGS
